
1. There was a good representation of parents from the different classes across the school.

3. It was positive again to see so many engaging with these online packages. For those children not using the apps, reasons given included they did not know about it, did not have the login details, their children were resistant.


Does your child regularly practise on Numbots or TTRS?

- 6. There were some really useful suggestions on how homework could be improved including:
 - Paper copies of homework that are set for the week including a weekend to complete.
 - Homework should focus on the core subjects Maths and English. It should be linked to their learning that week.
 - Have a homework book or folder so they take pride in their tasks.
 - Clear guidance for parents on expectations including worked examples for reference.
 - Homework after-school class for children whose parents work and cannot support their children.
 - Homework support at Dragon Club for children whose parents work.
 - A parent homework collaboration group run by FOSS so parents could support each other with their understanding.
 - Differentiated homework to support the different needs of children.
 - Less homework as the school day is longer and children are tired when they get home from school.
