Remote Learning Provision


We have slightly changed our remote learning provision!

First of all, we all sat together to listen to Jo Day talk about Newbury,

the funding the town council receives as well as the various jobs it has to do.

We were then split into 2 groups. One group had a tour of the Town Hall and had to complete a quiz -

we learned that the architect and builder were called Money and Crook!


