

#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

On Tuesday, we welcomed back Whiteknights English Hub to work with us on our early reading and phonics provision. The learning walk we did across reception and infants showcased just how far we have come on our reading journey! Miss Woodward (our visitor) was amazed by the significant progress ALL children had made - from September where many pupils were struggling to blend, until now where the majority of children are reading with increased fluency and confidence. Our youngest pupils should feel incredibly proud of all they have achieved. A special 'shout-out' to Jake, Leyla, Oscar and Riley who have all shown phenomenal progress in their reading and confidence.

Linking onto this, I wanted to reinforce the importance of both reading at home and recording on the Boom Reader app. We continue to have our weekly school competition to see which class has the most '3 or more reads' in a week. 

This week the children in Wisteria Class have been busy making their toy cars. They learnt all about how to use tools safely and have been putting this into practise!





