The children in Reception have started exploring paint in their art lessons. On Tuesday we looked at how paint feels using our hands before moving on to look at powder paint and water colour!







Lower Juniors worked as a team to apply our geographical knowledge to create a river, writing definitions of each part before constructing them.

The children are having great fun in their After School Clubs!








The children enjoyed making cubes in Infant Art Club last week. Each cube has drawings of their favourite things.
