Re: End of Term Arrangements

We have 3 weeks left of this academic year and as we come to the end of term, we are ensuring the children are ready for the next steps on their learning journey.

EYFS and Infants

For the next three Fridays (2nd, 9th and 16th July) the EYFS children will be spending one hour from 10.15 am to 11.15 am with their new Infant Teacher to get used to the Infant classroom and environment. After spending an hour in their new class, they will then go back to their current EYFS classroom for the remainder of the day. Due to COVID restrictions, we cannot mix bubbles as we would normally do. Therefore, during this one hour slot, all Infant children will experience an extra hour of PE. To ensure that these transitions run smoothly, please could your child come to school in their PE kit on Fridays, so that they do not waste any time changing. After the PE session from 10.15 am to 11.15 am, the children will return to their normal class. We will ensure that your child brings home their PE kit every Thursday, so they have them ready for the Friday morning PE session. Please ensure they bring them back to school on the Monday.

Moving Up Days – 19th, 20th and 21st July 2021

In order to follow the COVID restrictions, children will be moving to their new classes for next year for 3 days from Monday 19th July to Wednesday 21st July. These will be full and exciting days, when they will meet their new classmates and their new teacher, working on our book Hike by Pete Oswald. Wednesday will be a shorter day with a staggered finish at 12 pm for EYFS and Infants, and 12.15 pm for Juniors. Our Year 6 pupils will be involved with separate activities from 19th July to 21st July. A separate letter will follow for Year 6 parents detailing the arrangements. We will stick to our normal staggered start and end of day timings.

Please don't forget there is a FoSS meeting on Tuesday 13th July at 7 pm on the field, weather permitting, to discuss the proposed Autumn Fair. Mrs Julie Lewry, our new Headteacher, will be attending to find out about the work of FoSS.
