We have seen an increasing number of issues coming into school linked to friends falling out on WhatsApp groups.


Attached to this newsletter are some useful posters to support parents with keeping their children safe online.

Infant Trip to the Corn Exchange







The children in Reception this week learnt a little more about Queen Elizabeth II.


We have learnt that she has been Queen for 70 years and is celebrating her Platinum Jubilee.


Together we have drawn pictures of the Queen and created letters,

which we are going to send to her next week.












This week, Upper Key Stage 2 children have practised their sewing skills.
