## Home Learning EYFS Week Beginning: 1<sup>st</sup> June 2020

This terms learning is called Where in the World! We are all going to become explorers and need to put on our investigation goggles to explore the world around us! First stop- our home and where we live, the United Kingdom!



**Literacy-** We are learning all about our local area this week. You live in Newbury, which is a town in the United Kingdom. Can you try and find it on a map with help from Mummy or Daddy? Can you draw a map of the UK or a picture of where you live? What do you know about Newbury? Who lives there? Where is it close to? How can you get to Newbury? **UW-** We are very lucky to live in a beautiful part of the world, not everywhere in the world has green grass, lots of trees and flowers. All of the plants and flowers have help from little friends and we would like you to go on a bug hunt to your local park or garden and see how many you can find? They maybe under stones or pots, inside watering cans and behind sticks and leaves, so make sure you look everywhere! There is a bug hunt sheet at the end for you to tick.

**Maths game-** In the United Kingdom we use money called the Pound, it is different to other money in other countries. Can you play on this game to add the correct amount of coins to pay for the item in the shop? <u>https://www.topmarks.co.uk/money/toy-shop-money</u>

**EAD-** We would like it if you could make a simple kite using the colours of the Great British flag, red, white and blue. To make your kite, you will need newspaper/ baking paper/ tissue paper/ thin card, 4 sticks, string and tape. **Reading & writing-** Can you have a go at reading either Moths (Red Level) or The Web (Yellow Level). Simply go to the link and type in the name of the book in the search bar <a href="https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/">https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/</a> Now you have had a go at reading the book, we would like you to write about the mini-beasts that were in the story! Can you describe the bug and tell us three things about the way it looks? Don't forget to use your robot arms to sound it out!

**Maths game** – Use tape or string to make your own large 3D web! How will you connect it? How will you have to move to ensure it stays together? Can you go under it? Over it? Through it?



Now you have made your web, make 20 flies! You could use rolled up tissue, pom poms, or paper. Can you throw them at the web and count how many stuck to it? Can you write the subtraction sum to match? For example you had 20 flies, 8 got stuck to the web, you have 12 left- 20-8=12. If you don't have string or tape, you can always draw the web with chalk outside or flour!

**Maths investigation-** Each country in the world has their own flag, the United Kingdom's is called the Union Jack, and it has three colours in it- red, white and blue. How many different patterns can you make using these colours? You could use your fingers and paint to make the patterns.



**PSED-** Earlier this week you learnt about Newbury, can you draw a picture of your favourite place in Newbury? Maybe it's the park, or school, swimming pool or library. We would then like it if you could share your love of your local area and put a smile on someone else's face by writing who it is to and let them know you are thinking of them. You could then post it through another family members or friend's letter box putting a BIG smile on their face.

**EAD**- Summer has arrived in the United Kingdom, we know because the weather has become much hotter! In the Summer, its wonderful to be outside and enjoy an ice lolly.
