Why Kingswood?

- Kingswood have been running school residential trips on the Isle of Wight for 35 years.

Kingswood Centre

The centre covers 100 acres of beautiful woodland and fields in a superb cliff top location, overlooking Whitecliff Bay with direct access to the beach.

The centre has five residential buildings and an all-weather activity zone.

Surrounded by "Jurassic" coastline designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest, this is the most important area of Europe for dinosaur fossils, making the Isle of Wight perfect for Environmental Field Studies.

The centre has on site sports pitches, dining hall, chapel and a disco hall!

Every child will benefit from a Kingswood adventure. Character development is at the core of each Kingswood programme with a focus on confidence, resilience and life skills, which are delivered through a carefully designed mix of challenge, play and reflection.

It's not every day that they get the chance to go canoeing, abseiling, and fencing, and it's the shared sense of accomplishment that comes with these activities which is so invaluable to young people. Not only that but it also helps to develop and improve key skills such as teamwork, confidence, and resilience."

Accommodation

The Isle of Wight has standard dormitory style accommodation. Rooms range from 4 to 12 bed dormitories, with genderseparated bathroom and shower facilities and party leader rooms close by. Sheets, duvets and pillows are provided for all guests.

The lodge sites offer a close community feel with campfire areas, perfect for team bonding in the evening.

Pupils will get the opportunity to choose some friends they would like to share with, we can't guarantee they will get all their choices but they will get at least one!

Food

Each day there is a carefully balanced and nutritional meal plan, recently updated to meet and exceed the latest Government standards on young people's diets.
